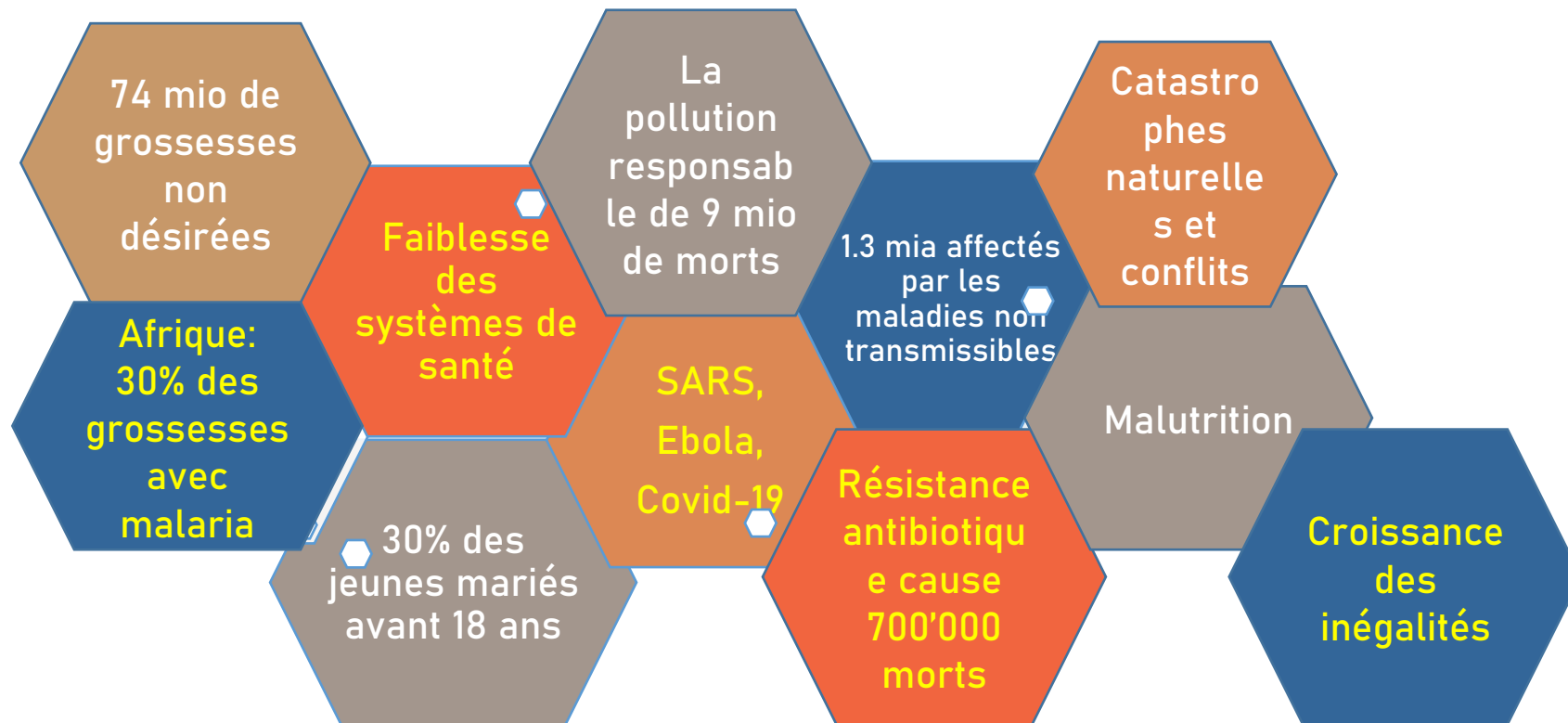

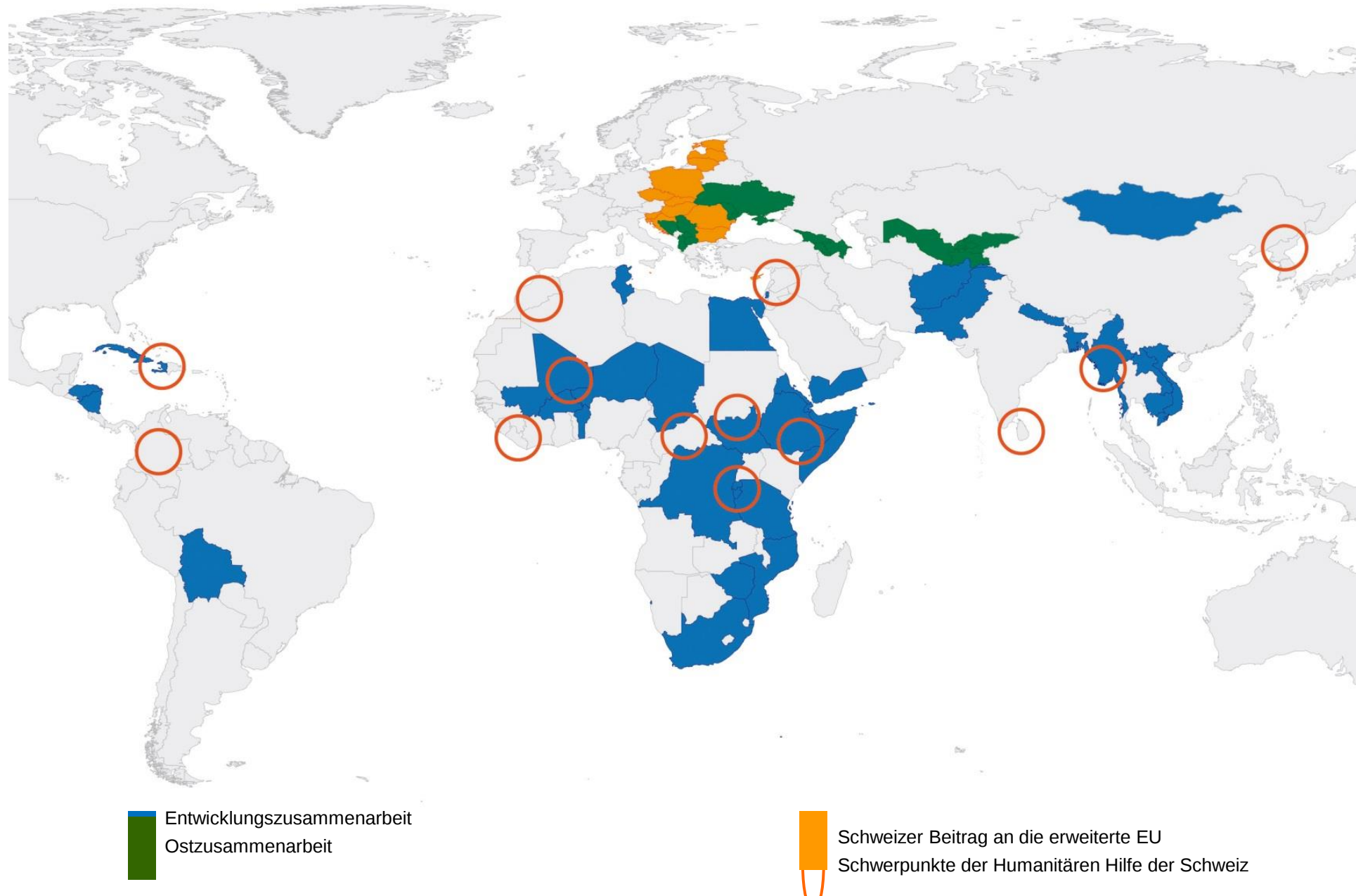

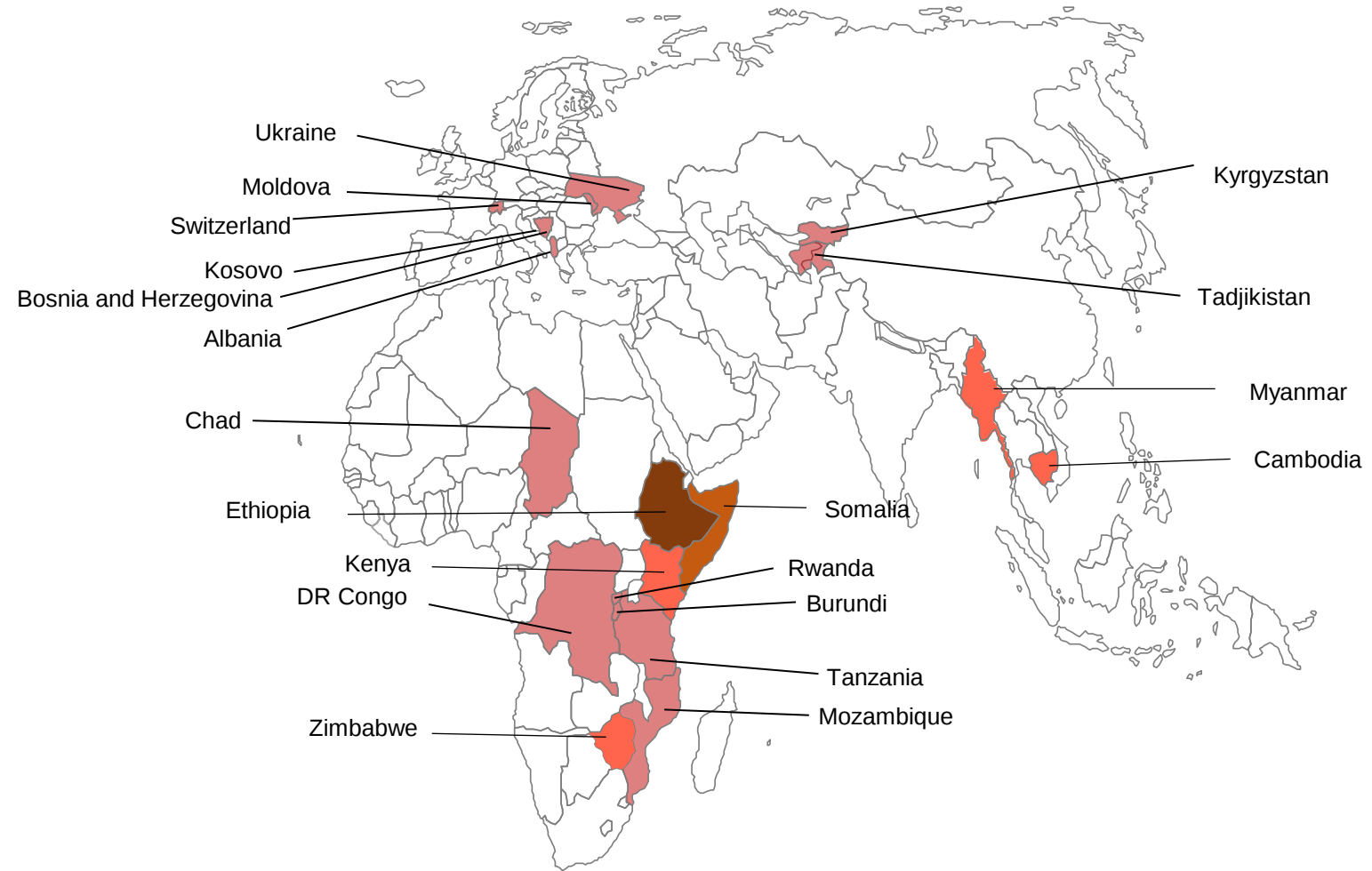


Régions et pays prioritaires de la DDC 2021-2024





Programmes santé dans plus de 20 pays

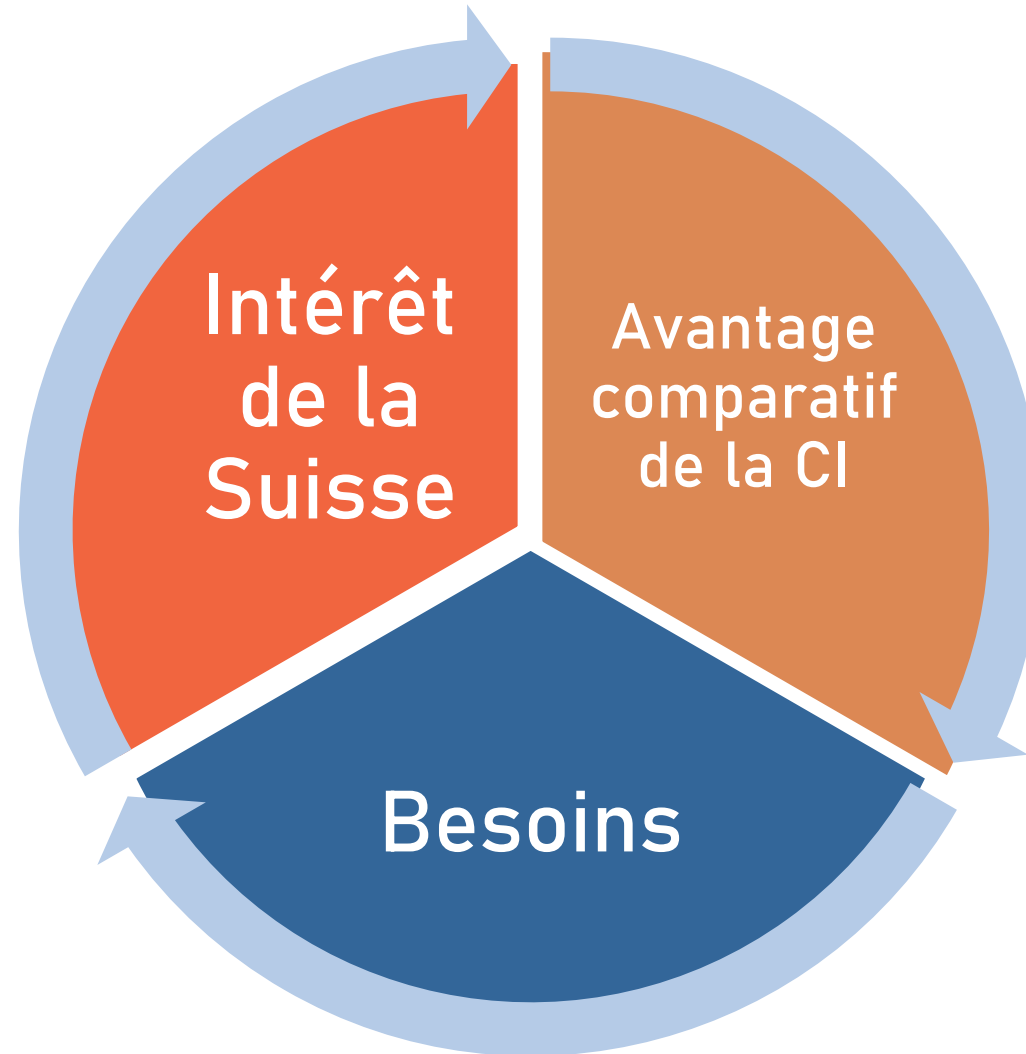

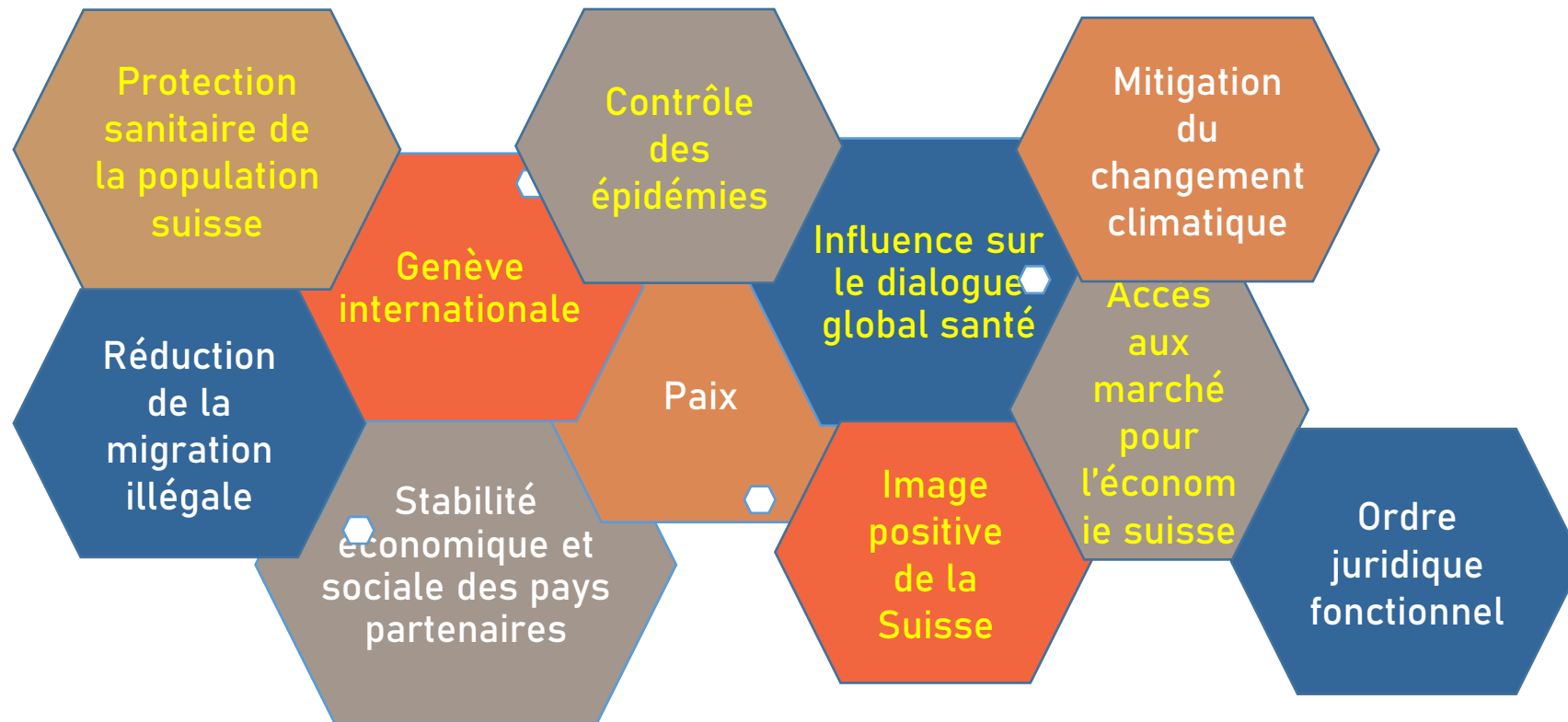

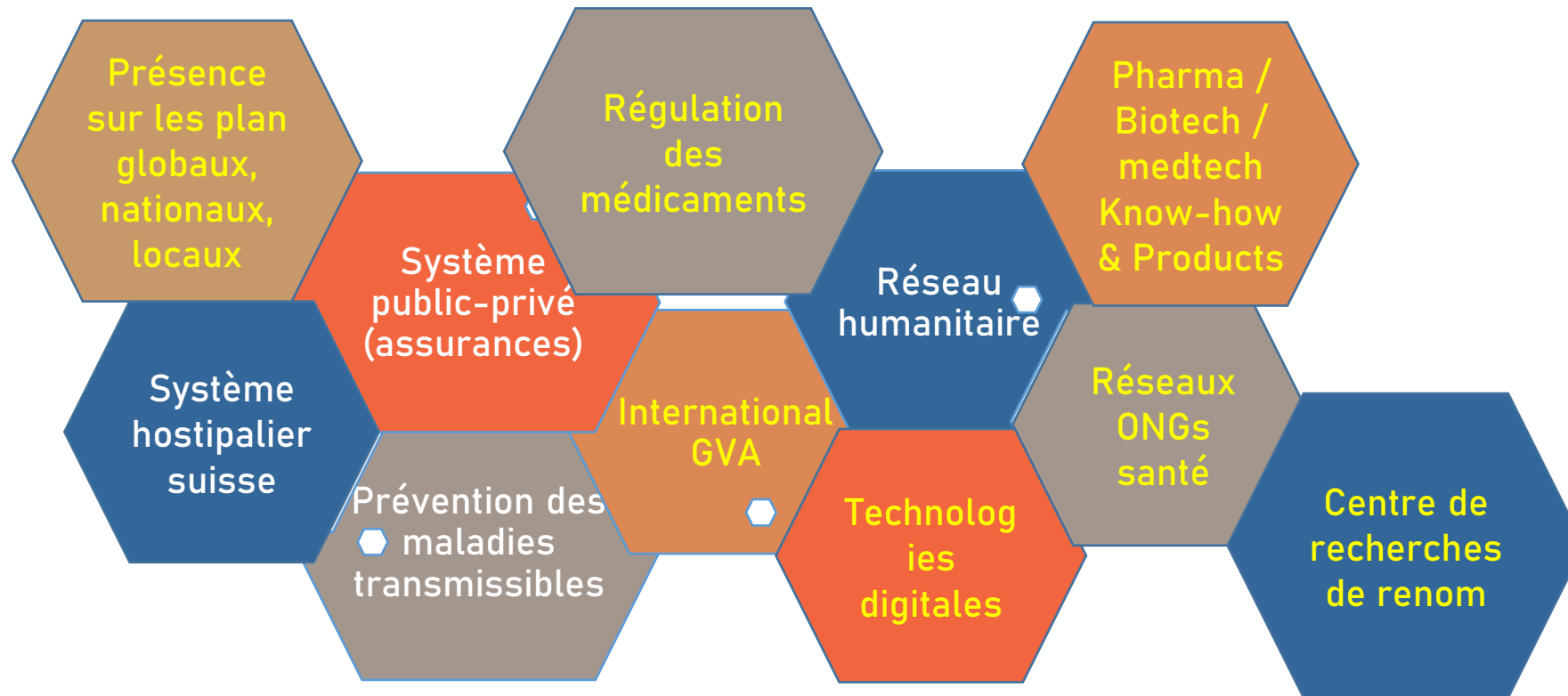
L'aide publique au développement (APD) de la Suisse → 0,46% du revenu national brut

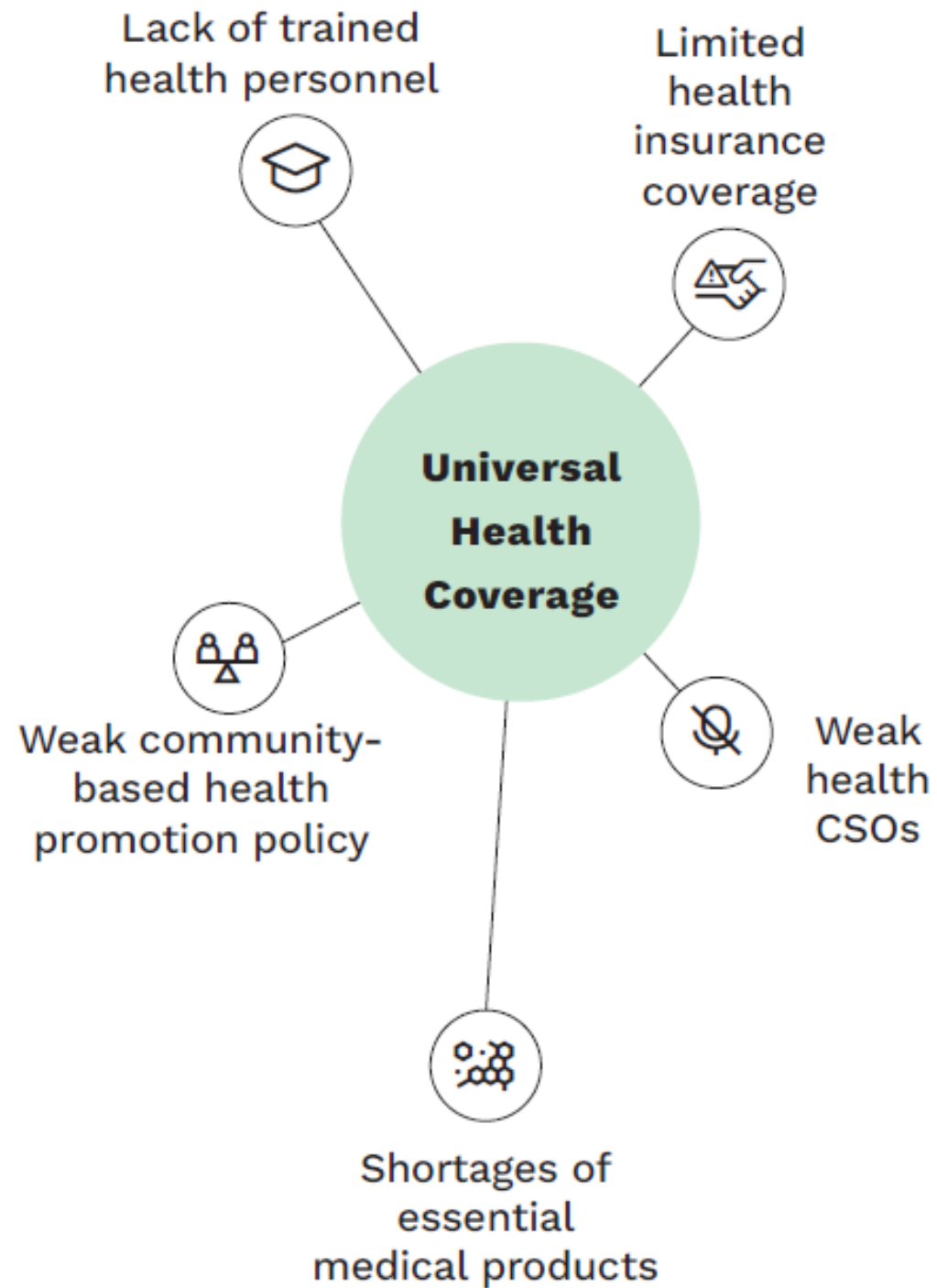
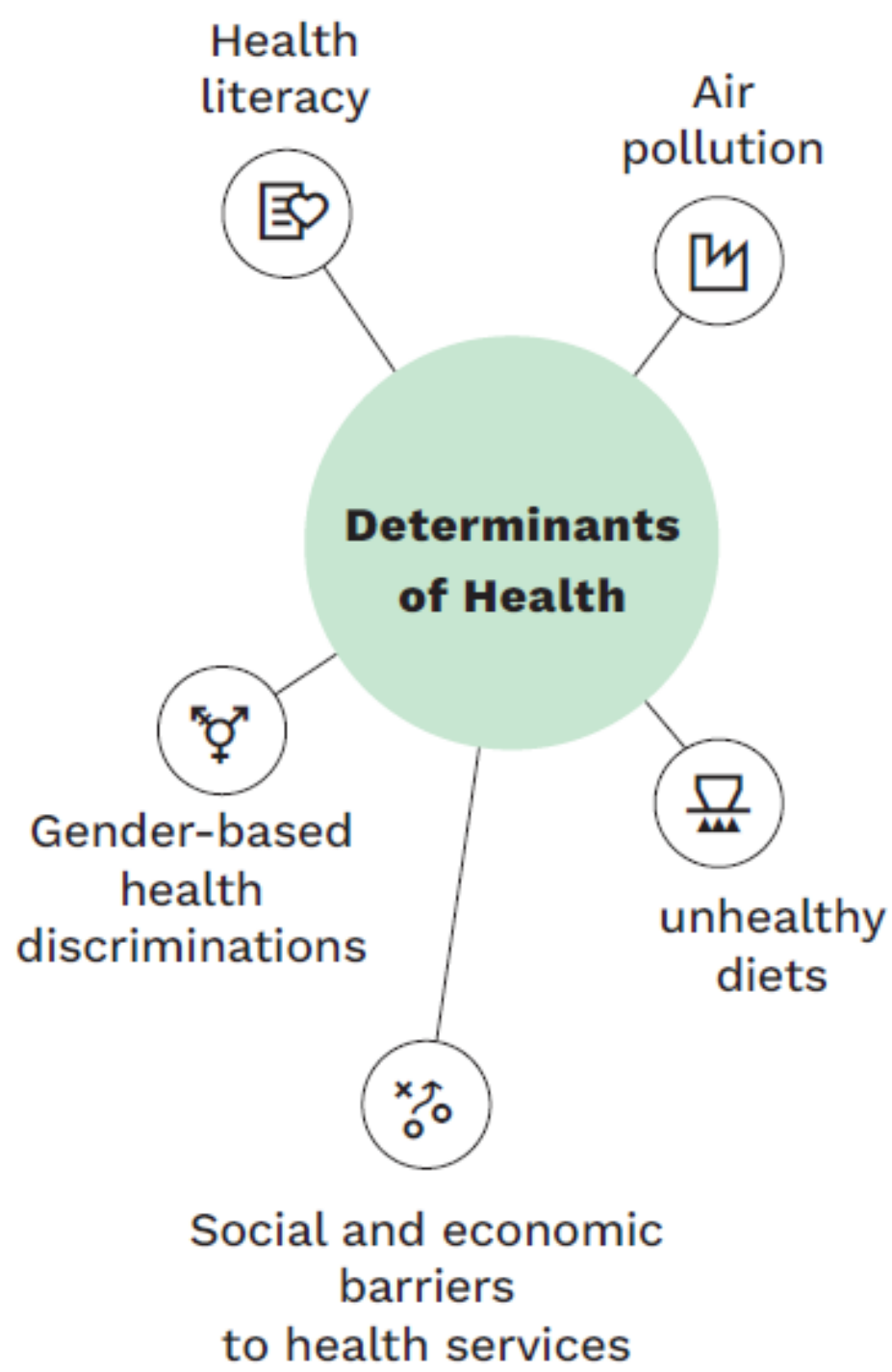

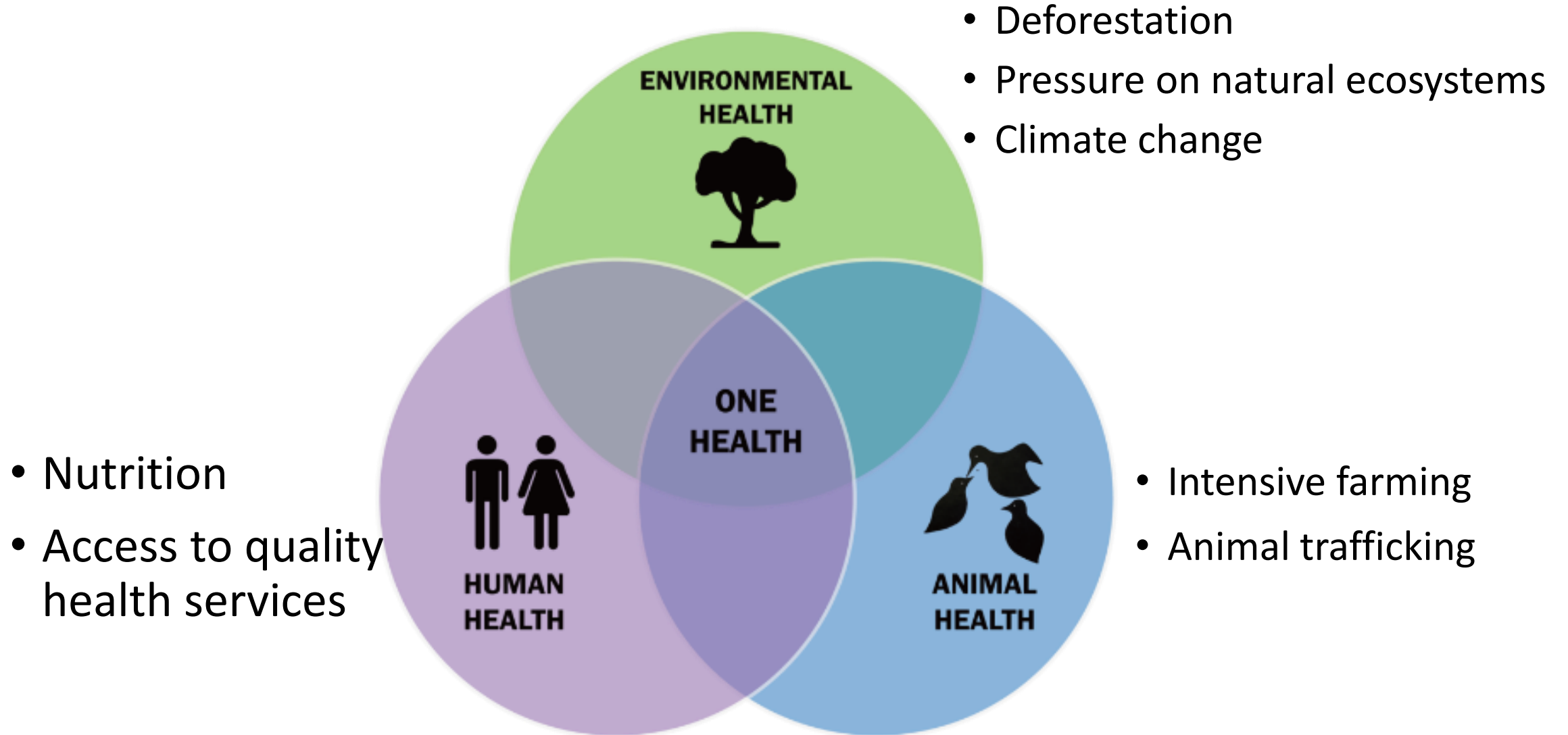

Protection de la biodiversité



Parcs nationaux en Afrique

- Préservation de la biodiversité (érosion des sols)
- Gestion durable des ressources
- Soutiens aux aires protégées → développement durable
- “Buffer zones” – mixité entre activité humaine, biodiversité, tourisme
- Preservation du territoire naturel – Ebola (RDC)



Global Environment Facility (gef)

the world's largest funder of biodiversity protection, nature restoration, and climate change response in developing countries.

co-financing more than 5,000 national and regional projects, plus 27,000 community ventures through its Small Grants Programme.

CH contribution: CHF 118 million (2019-2022)

International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)

promote nature-based solutions for major societal challenges including climate change, water security, disaster risk reduction, land degradation, food security and gender equity and equality.

convenor for influencing policy, using scientific evidence, setting standards. inform the decision-making and practices of policy-makers, civil society, private sector leaders and others across the global environment.

Health determinants – Air pollution



Air pollution from open fires and smelters near Bantala, Kolkata, India

- Pollution is killing 9 million people a year
- 92% of pollution-related deaths occur in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).
- Toxic chemicals resulted in 1.8 million deaths, which is more than from HIV/Aids.
- Prevention was largely overlooked in the international development agenda

Global Alliance for on Health and Pollution (GAHP)

network of international and national level agencies committed to a collaborative, multi-sectoral approach to address the global pollution crisis and the resulting health and economic impacts.

Climate and Clean Air in Latin American Cities

Shift towards low-carbon urban transport and non-road mobile machinery in Chile, Colombia, Mexico and Peru. normative and technological changes through regional cooperation, building on Swiss expertise, and sharing experiences at the global level.

CHF 3.2m Current phase: 2021–2025

Air Pollution Impact on Health, Mongolia

Reduction of air pollution risks to maternal and child health in the most polluted areas of Ulaanbaatar and one provincial centre.

Gathers information on air pollution and its health impacts;
Improves risk reduction measures such as the installation of advanced ventilation systems in kindergartens.

CHF 4.9m Current phase: 2018–2022
